Worries Outernational

Worries Outernational have been running their weekly 'Dancehall Styles' club in the Temple Bar Music Centre / Button Factory for over 5 years. The biggest and best loved reggae club in the country, the worries boys are also a regular feature on the Irish festival circuit as well as doing frequent gigs across the UK and Europe.



DJ Synergy

Best known for his sets with the 'Reach' drum'n'bass collective Synergy's lesser known love for rhythm and blues brings out his more mellow side. A long time record collector Synergy will be playing classic soul and funk at the picnic.



Chantylace

Hailing from the Wicklow hills Chantylace follows her own musical path through life, taking in Soul, Jazz, Rock n Roll (her name comes from the Big Boppers hit 'Chantilly Lace') and Reggae in her sets.



Ras Eddy & Ryan Dan (2B Sound)

Individually hailing from Africa & the Caribbean and with shared roots in New York, Ras Eddy & Ryan Dan are one of Dublin's top dancehall teams. Having successfully run club nights around town and promoted several reggae gigs they are also the people behind the 'Reggae Family' clothing shop in Dublin.



DJ Relax

Hailing from Amsterdam DJ Relax has been living and playing out in Ireland for the past several years. Focusing on the new roots sound coming out of the UK & Jamaica he is a regular on Sundays in the Button Factory and has played numerous other venues in Ireland and the Netherlands.



Jam Master Jamie & The Curious Culchies

Straight outta Tipperary, boy. He might be more Mullinahone than Mississippi but JMJ has the deepest of love for real Soul music. Regularly playing out with the 'Kettle' crew he both entertains and educates with rarities from his vast collection.



T Woc

One half of the foundation of the Alphabet Set, T Woc has been a vinyl collector and beat maker for the longest time, as well as hosting his own weekly show on Radio na Life and playing regularly with Rootical Soundsystem. More recently he has teamed up with Don Rosco and Richie Kaboogie to put on the Wobble Dubstep nights in Dublin.



Revelation Soundsystem

Revelation sound system is the only Rasta sound system vibrating Irish dancefloors with pure positivity for the last decade. Brothers Jeremiah and Benjamin play the traditional roots sound together in a King David style, combining rhythms from the earliest reggae recordings to the marching dub anthems of today.



Firehouse Skank Soundsystem

The original Irish reggae sound, Dublin's Firehouse Skank have been keeping true to the roots since they first formed in 1993. For 10 years they ran their legendary Wednesday nights in the Parnell Mooney and continue to play out regularly. Expect nothing but the finest in all things reggae.



Rootical Soundsystem

A roots sound based in Galway with a history of reggae promotion going back to the early 90's, recent years have seen Rootical build up their own custom sound system which has devastated venues up and down the country. Expect everything from foundation to exclusive dubplates and some of the best live MC's in Ireland.



Don Rosco

One of the finest DJ's in the country Don Rosco made his name playing jungle as part of the Bassbin crew in Dublin. Reaching out from this he has been running the Don Ross & Stacks radio show for several years' now highlighting jazz, dub and jungle sounds.



Andy Culture

Up and coming reggae selector Andy Culture hails from Dublin and is renowned for playing only the best in vintage foundation tunes. With his heart firmly in the golden era of rocksteady and early reggae of the 60's Andy's style sets him apart from other reggae DJ's.



Richie !Kaboogie

Best known for their hardcore mix of Dubstep, grime and mashup sounds, Richie of the !Kaboogie crew is ready to show a more mellow side at the picnic.



DJ Halfdutch

One of the most talented DJ's working in Dublin today, DJ Halfdutch is equally successful across several genres, be it funk, soul, hip hop or reggae. Playing weekly across Dublin for the likes of Choice Cuts and Human Music Halfdutch also hosts a weekly radio show on Radio na Life.



Crazy D

Hailing from May Pen, Jamaica, Crazy D is best known for his energetic sets and latest tracks from back home, giving Irish clubs a taste of the real dancehall bashment from Jamaica.

Carlos has been dj'ing in Dublin since '95, originally playing house, but now it's a mixed bag of funk, soul, reggae, hip hop, indie, rock, ska, d'n'b, house, electro, punk (etc...). Switched to CD a couple of years back thanks to the clever people at Pioneer...so not a real Dj any more...
